After having met with the Information, Communication, and Technology (ICT) Exploratory Committee and having received further clarifications of elements of the report, I now accept the Committee's report as the final document of record in this proceeding.

My acceptance of the ICT report should not be interpreted to mean that I agree with the recommendations as they are specifically stated, or that I will act directly on them. My acceptance simply acknowledges that this is the official report of record that I will use in the formulation of my programmatic recommendations to the Chancellor and to the Boulder campus faculty as we move forward.

The high level recommendations you provided met the spirit of my charge to you. They will provide valuable guidance in our efforts to create a contemporary and forward thinking program that is designed to a) better prepare students to successfully pursue interests and careers in an increasingly complex and rapidly changing information, communication, and technology landscape, and b) take advantage of the considerable scholarly assets that are distributed across our campus.

I would like to thank the Committee for their efforts. From the report it is clear that you have made every reasonable effort to reach out to and solicit input from constituencies both on and off campus. I also deeply appreciate that fact that you have conducted your work on a very tight timeline.
